

March Guest Speaker: Bradley P. Jacob



Brad Jacob has been an Associate Professor at Regent University School of Law since 2001. His teaching expertise includes Constitutional Law, Christian Foundations of Law, Constitutional Criminal Procedure, and Nonprofit Tax-Exempt Organizations.

Before coming to Regent, Professor Jacob served: as founding Provost and Dean of Patrick Henry College (1998-2000); as Executive Director/CEO of the Christian Legal Society (1991-93); as Associate Dean of the proposed School of Law at Geneva College (1993-98); as a Staff Attorney in the Center for Law & Religious Freedom (1988-91); and as director of a Justice Fellowship think-tank at Prison Fellowship Ministries (2000-01).

He is the author of a number of scholarly articles, including: *Eight Men Out – Make That Nine; The Bible and the Constitution; Griswold and the Defense of Traditional Marriage; Will the Real Constitutional Originalist Please Stand Up? Back to Basics: Constitutional Meaning and “Tradition,”* and *Free Exercise in the “Lobbying Nineties.”*

Professor Jacob began his career as an attorney in Baltimore with the major international law firm now known as DLA Piper.

Professor Jacob has been married since 1983 and is the home-schooling father of eight children. He is interviewed in print and broadcast media around the country, and serves as a regular guest on *Macrini’s Morning News Team* on WNIS-AM in Hampton Roads.

Sugared Pecans: Submitted by Ginny Garcia

1 Egg White
1 T water (2 t water, 1 t Vanilla)
1 lb Pecan Halves
1 C Sugar
 $\frac{3}{4}$ t Salt
 $\frac{1}{2}$ t Cinnamon



Pre-Heat oven to 250 degrees F. Grease one baking sheet; can use foil & grease.

In a mixing bowl, whip together the egg white, water and vanilla until frothy. In a separate bowl, mix together sugar, salt, and cinnamon.

Add pecans to egg whites, stir to coat the nuts evenly. Remove the nuts, and toss them in the sugar mixture until coated. Spread the nuts out on the prepared baking sheet. Bake at 250 degrees F for 45 minutes to 1 hour. Stir every 15 minutes.

VFRW Literacy/Mamie Eisenhower Library Project (MELP)

The above named project honors the wives of two American Presidents who recognized that if we wish to improve the lives of our children we must open their eyes to the wonders they can find on the printed page – whether it now be a digital page or one traditionally found between the covers of a book.

Those of us who found our imagination awakened, our curiosity heightened, and our knowledge increased or had dreams of what we might be or what we might do by reading the stories of great people from the past, were blessed by having parents, grandparents, teachers, and librarians who fostered such exploration. Unfortunately, so many young people today are not as fortunate.


Barbara Bush is quoted as saying, “The American Dream is about equal opportunity for everyone who works hard. If we don’t give them the ability to read and write, then we aren’t giving everyone an opportunity to succeed”.

We can make a difference and literacy is one area where we can help change lives. Focusing on the primary grades is a very good place to start! If children can’t read by the 4th grade they will continue to fall behind their peers. Talk with your School Board member and find the school in your community that has the most children at risk. Ask the principal what you as a club can do to help change the equation. Maybe its school supplies; work books, math cards, reading books, dictionaries; maybe they would appreciate having people help with reading or numbers. Principals and school librarians know best what is needed most, so do ask.

April 9-15 is National Library Week this year, with the theme” Libraries Transform”, a celebration of the contribution of libraries and librarians. This would be a good time to donate books to your local or school library. Have a picture taken that you can submit to your newspaper! If you need suggestions for books, go to NFRW.org. Click on: Programs, Literacy and Education, MELP. MELP has a list of titles spanning all ages. Their theme is “The Future We Remember” but lest we forget the past, most of the books deal with moments in history. Once you decide, perhaps your librarian will order the books as ours does. We have been able stretch our contribution this way. Let me know the titles of the books you purchase and I will be happy to order the NFRW book plates.

NFRW has designated September as “Literacy Month”. The federation will recognize clubs who document their work to promote literacy so let NFRW know by October 31st. If you share also with me, I will ask to have them posted on our website so others may benefit and perhaps implement your project in their own community. For example, some past projects have been reading to nursing home residents, working with challenged students, tutoring adults, providing reading material to adult / juvenile detention centers. Send me your success stories! Your efforts will make a difference!

The Princess Anne Republican Women's Club was formed in 1989 to accommodate working women, as well as those who preferred an evening meeting. The original club applied to the Virginia Federation of Republican Women for our charter with twelve members and met at the Life Federal Savings and Loan building on Laskin Road.

Jean Ford (deceased) served as the first president and has been followed by many capable leaders.

The PARWC has tripled in membership, small in comparison to many clubs, but we boast that we have one of the most active clubs with members attending every meeting and participating in our activities. Our program emphasis is on political education.

Over the years, we have held a number of fund raising events, most notable our annual sale of the White House Historical Society Christmas ornaments. Our largest fund raiser is the Star Spangled Ball which is jointly sponsored by the four Virginia Beach Republican Women's Clubs. Two thousand fifteen is the 26th Star Spangled Ball. The monies earned are divided equally among the clubs and are earmarked to support our Republican candidates.

We are proud that two of our members have been named to judgeships in Virginia Beach, one of our members presently serves as Clerk of the Circuit Court, one of our former members served in the United State Congress, and two of our members currently serve on the Virginia Beach City Council. Our members have served or are currently serving on the Virginia Beach School Board, two have been elected to the Presidential Electoral College, and many others have held numerous positions in the Virginia Beach Republican City Committee, as well as serving as officers and board members of the Virginia Federation of Republican Women. We have managed campaigns and have had a viable presence in every Republican campaign since being chartered.

Our Community Outreach projects have included the American Cancer Relay for Life, the Judeo-Christian Outreach Center Pre-school for at-risk children, the USO "Support our Troops" project, providing holiday bags for the Psychiatric Ward at Portsmouth Naval Medical Center, sending monthly boxes to our troops in Iraq and Afghanistan, contributions to Wounded Warriors, Operation Home Front,
