Support for 2021 Statewide Ticket**

Alexandria, VA - The Virginia Federation of Republican Women's (VFRW) President Paula Steiner sent her congratulations to the winners of the 2021 RPV State Convention and pledged the VFRW's support to helping the candidates win in November. The winning candidates include businessman Glenn Youngkin for Governor, Marine veteran Winsome Sears for Lieutenant Governor, and Delegate Jason Miyares for Attorney General.

"We should be incredibly proud of this ticket," said Steiner. "At last night's rally in Richmond, the energy level felt like we are poised for a big win in November. This is a dynamic and diverse group of Virginians who are determined to bring our Commonwealth out of the darkness of the McAuliffe-Northam era. No more shut down businesses, no more shut down schools, no more calls to defund the police, and - most of all - no more Virginians moving out of the state to flee the radical agenda of Virginia Democrats."

The Republican Party of Virginia held an unassembled convention on Saturday, May 8, 2021 to select its candidates for Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and Attorney General. The unassembled convention took place in polling locations in each jurisdiction across the Commonwealth. A record breaking 53,524 delegates registered for the convention.
