Establishing a New VFRW Club

(For VFRW District Representatives)

I. Recruitment

- A. Visit local committee meetings
 - Ask Committee Chair for a few minutes at their next meeting.
- B. Place an announcement in local papers.
- C. Post a notice in local Victory Centers

II. Speak about the advantages of joining a Federated Club

- A. Notify VFRW President and 2nd Vice President of intent to establish a new club.
- B. Membership in the largest women's political organization in America
 - Dues provide membership not only to your local club but also to the Virginia Federation of Republican Women (VFRW) http://vfrw.org/ and the National Federation of Republican Women (NFRW) http://www.nfrw.org/
- C. Effective leadership training
 - NFRW Campaign Management School http://nfrw.org/programs/political education.htm
 - VFRW Leadership Training for club presidents and officers http://vfrw.org/leadership-training/
 - Plus many connections to other Republican and Leadership training institutes and seminars.

D. Scholarships

- NFRW National Pathfinder Scholarship The three annual scholarships of \$2,500 provide financial assistance and support to women seeking undergraduate or graduate degrees.

- Betty Rendel Scholarship The three annual scholarships of \$1,000 are awarded to female undergraduates who are majoring in political science, government or economics and have successfully completed at least two years of college coursework. http://www.nfrw.org/documents/awards/rendel.pdf
- VFRW Political Studies Scholarships The VFRW awards three \$1,000 scholarships annually to young women who are undergraduate or graduate students enrolled in an accredited Virginia college or university, studying government, political science, or law. http://vfrw.org/programs/scholarships-awards/

E. Recognition

- As a member of the largest women's political organization in America, elected officials and candidates know that you are a serious asset to their careers and campaigns.
- Newspapers and other media recognize the Federation as a group of dedicated women who are actively working to increase the effectiveness of women in the cause of good government through involvement in political activities.
- VFRW Annual Convention including prominent speakers, workshops and special recognition awards for clubs and individuals.
- III. Have handouts to give them an idea of what you are talking about.
 - A. Among the handouts include an explanation of some of the advantages of belonging to the Federation as listed in Section II.
 - B. Included a copy of the Presidents Guidelines for planning meetings and activities. Explain that it doesn't mean that clubs are required to complete everything on the list. It is merely a means of Award Recognition for those who do complete them and a measurement of the contributions women make to the political process. http://vfrw.org/wp-content/uploads/2013/06/VFRW GUIDELINES FOR 2013 PROPOSED-1.pdf

 - Explain the criteria for establishing a new club is
 - 1. Must have 10 members or more
 - 2. All must support the Republican Creed
 - 3. Should commit to attending regular meetings
 - 4. Must be willing to support Republican candidates
 - 5. Must have New Club Package to the VFRW President no less than 30 days prior to the next Board of Director's meeting.
- IV. Help prepare Bylaws.
 - A. It is very helpful if you give them a copy of either your club's

bylaws (if they are up to date) or the latest version of the VFRW bylaws to use as a template.

- Decide on a club name, preferably beginning with or ending with "Republican Women"
- Review bylaws and standing rules with the president.
- Advise of the difference between the bylaws and the standing rules.
 - Explain how to set their annual dues, keeping in mind they should cover the VFRW & NFRW dues as well as the annual \$30 fee to the VFRW. (Sum # of members x VFRW dues + Woman's Candidate Fund then add annual service charge. Divide total by # of members)

B. Club members should vote to approve the final draft of the bylaws and standing rules.

V. Complete required paperwork as discussed on the NFRW Website.

- A. Create membership application (suggestions on website)
 - Use applications to make a membership list with Name, Address, Phone numbers and Email addresses.
 It is useful to create this list in an Excel format which can be easily updated.
- B. Complete the Charter Application
 - Found on NFRW website.

 - Prepare check from club's treasurer as calculated on Charter Application form

- C. Club President prepare a Letter of Intent to use as a cover letter for Application Package.

- D. District Representative prepare a Letter of Recommendation to accompany package.
 - Be sure to ask the VFRW President has made to make time for a vote at the next Board meeting no less than 30 days prior to meeting.
 - Be prepared to speak on behalf of the new club at the BOD meeting
 - Invite prospective members to the Board meeting and introduce them to the membership.
